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ARTIST STATEMENT

Nicole Morris is a Black working-class poet and essayist. After a decades-long career in the service industry as a waitress, she began writing professionally in 2023 while on the postgraduate Creative Writing course at the University of Galway, Ireland, under the mentorship of Elaine Feeney and Mike McCormack. Nicole is a recipient of the 2025 Irish Arts Council Literature Bursary Award, the 2026 Cúirt New Writing Prize, and is a Tin House Workshop alum. Her writing has been featured in numerous Irish and North American literary journals. She writes story-driven personal narratives drawing from her lived experience as a mother, a once-wife, an educator, and a descendant of generations of outcasts, survivors, deadbeats, addicts, and the mentally ill. Her writing interrogates topics of identity, power hierarchies, harm/repair, intention/impact, and attempts to answer essential questions about who deserves to be forgiven, forsaken, or forgotten. Originally from Los Angeles, she lives in the west of Ireland, where she never tires of the wind or rain.
